## **MEMORANDUM**

FROM: Gerald Green, AICP, Executive Director RE: MPC FY 2018 Budget Amendment # 1

Additional planning opportunities have arisen since the adoption of the budget earlier this year. As a result a budget amendment is necessary in order properly reflect additional revenues and expenses for new activities.

In the area of transportation, MPC, working through the Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), has contracts with the City of Alcoa and the City of Maryville to undertake two planning studies. For the City of Alcoa a Downtown Master plan will be developed for the old Alcoa, Inc. west plant site. For the City of Maryville a Greenway Connections Plan will be completed. Further, we anticipate engaging a consultant to undertake an update to the region's Intelligent Transportation System Architecture. Further, we plan to hire consultants to assist MPC and the City of Knoxville in conducting a Chapman Highway corridor study. Also, we will begin the first phase of an update of the Travel Demand Model that the TPO staff uses for planning purposes. Finally, working with Knox County staff the services of a consultant will be retained to conduct a Hardin Valley Transportation Infrastructure Implementation Plan. Funding for these studies will come from federal transportation dollars, local government match and MPC fund balance. The costs of these activities are identified in the table below.

MPC staff has identified a need to increase outreach and community participation in Recode Knoxville as it enters the next important phase of development. A draft work plan has been prepared to undertake this effort. Finally, there has been an ongoing discussion by staff to pursue a rebranding effort of MPC. A small amount of funds will be targeted for this effort. Funds for these two efforts will come from MPC's reserved account. See funding table below.
