### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

# APPROVE musical instruction as a home occupation in the R-1 zoning district, subject to the following 7 conditions:

- 1. Meeting all applicable requirements of the Knoxville Zoning Ordinance.
- 2. Meeting all applicable requirements of the Knoxville Department of Engineering.
- 3. Adhering to all attached plans and stipulations for operation of a home occupation, as submitted by the applicant for purposes of this review.
- 4. No more than two customer vehicles may be parked on-site at one time.
- 5. No person, other than the applicant/resident, may work at the home occupation.
- 6. No retail sales of any products may take place at the home occupation.
- 7. Only one pupil at any given time will be allowed.

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With the conditions noted above, this requests meets all requirements for approval of a home occupation in the R-1 zoning district, as well as other criteria for approval of a use on review.

### COMMENTS:

The applicant is requesting approval to teach piano lesson outside of her home at this residence on Yosemite Trail. Home occupations are a use permitted on review in the R-1 zoning district, and musical instruction may be permitted as a home occupation. The applicant is proposing to dedicate 144 square feet in this 3,400 square foot house to the lesson area, which is approximately 4% of the total floor area of the house. The maximum area allowed for a home occupation is 25% of the total floor area. The applicant has agreed that only one pupil may be permitted to be instructed at any given time. Lessons will be scheduled from 3:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday. No signage is proposed for the home occupation.

EFFECT OF THE PROPOSAL ON THE SUBJECT PROPERTY, SURROUNDING PROPERTIES AND THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE

1. The request will not place any additional demand on schools and will have a minimal impact on street traffic. Public water and sewer utilities are in place to serve the site.

2. Only one student for instruction will be allowed at any one time, except there may be overlaps with students arriving for the next period of instruction.

# CONFORMITY OF THE PROPOSAL TO CRITERIA ESTABLISHED BY THE KNOXVILLE ZONING ORDINANCE

1. The proposal is consistent with all requirements for the R-1 zoning district, as well as other criteria for approval of a home occupation as a use on review.


2. The proposed home occupation is consistent with the following general standard for uses permitted on review: The proposal is consistent with the adopted plans and policies of the General Plan and Sector Plan. The use in is harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance. The use is compatible with the character of the neighborhood where it is proposed. The use will not significantly injure the value of adjacent property. The use will not draw substantial additional traffic through residential areas.

### CONFORMITY OF THE PROPOSAL TO ADOPTED MPC PLANS

1. The City of Knoxville One Year Plan and the Northwest City Sector Plan propose low density residential uses for the subject property.

2. The current R-1 zoning of the property permits consideration of home occupations as a use on review.

MPC's approval or denial of this request is final, unless the action is appealed to the Knoxville City Council. The date of the Knoxville City Council hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.

My name is Christina Horn and I reside at 5401 Yosemite Trail. I have lived in this neighborhood for one year and absolutely love it. People here are friendly and always say hello when they see me walking my two German Shepherds. I am a professional pianist with a Master's degree in piano pedagogy and teach piano lessons as my full time occupation. I have been doing so for 10 years. I am writing this letter to you, my neighbor, to inform you of what I do in my home so that you can feel like comfortable with my home occupation.

I teach 22 students a week, one at a time, for 30 minutes a piece. My hours of operation are Monday through Thursday from 3pm until 8pm. My students park in my driveway and come in through the back door of my basement. For the past year, my roommate has also taught one student at a time during the same hours. As of October 1, she will be moving. I will be the sole tenant and teacher living at 5401 Yosemite trail.

I write this letter also in apology for creating any inconvenience to you, my neighbor. This summer I had a group of 10 students come to my home for 8 days total: We played games in the yard but spent most of the morning in my basement studio. I now realize that the law only allows for one student at a time, and have ceased the program. Again, my sincerest apology for any disturbance this may have caused you, it will not happen again.

It is my desire to live within the laws of our community and to be a good neighbor. I believe that my home occupation is an honorable one and I strive to act in a professional manner. Please feel free at anytime to come by and speak with me or to call of you ever have any concerns.

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

### RE: Personal testimony for Christina Horn, piano teacher

Our son, Mackenzie has been a piano student for Christina Horn for nearly 2 years now. We have had some experience with piano instructors as she is his third teacher for the piano Ms. Horn's level of professionalism and consideration as a teacher have been unmet by any of the other instructors we have encountered thus far. Christina's methods, leadership and character are quite sterling. We believe that her consideration of her neighbors is also very high. She is forthright, honest, and very concerned about her neighbors and the area in which she lives

When we take our son for his lesson, he is her only student for the half hour we are in her home studio. As she has instructed us from the very beginning of her tenure in this neighborhood, we park in her driveway and do not block the road. We also drive with care in the subdivision as we know what it can be like when a road becomes very busy, or has a high amount of traffic

Ms. Horn's hours are after school from around 3 pm until 7 pm –only 4 hours per day. The music she teaches is classic and acoustic. Her methods are sound and practical. The caliber of her students is stellar, our son has received superior ratings on his piano playing whenever he has been in an evaluation situation. We know this to be the result of her instruction. Because of her teaching many children are prepared for higher learning not only in music, but in other areas as well. The discipline and principles she applies can be applied to many other fields as well.

We have found Christina Horn to be a reasonable, professional, and personable piano teacher and woman. We do not believe she will in any way take advantage of her neighbors or abuse them in her position as a piano instructor. We strongly recommend to the Commission that she be permitted to continue her piano instruction as she has for many years now


