## STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

- APPROVE the physical closure of this street section, subject to the requested easements, but not the relinquishing of the ownership of any of the ROW until the completion of the Western Ave. improvements. (See letters from TDOT and City Engineering.)
Closure of this street section will not impede the function of the remainder of Tennessee Ave. through the neighborhood, and is expected to improve traffic safety caused by large trucks becoming stuck in the dip located within this street section at the at-grade railroad crossing. (See attached letter.)


## COMMENTS:

The future improvement and realignment of Western Ave. through this area will also require this section of Tennessee Ave. to be closed, but some or all of the right-of-way may become part of the the realigned Western Ave right-of-way.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on $8 / 12 / 2008$ and $8 / 26 / 2008$. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.

## SUBJECT: Request to Close a Portion of Tennessee Avenue MPC File \# 7-C-08-SC / City Block 19524, 19620 \& 19720



Dear Mr. Pruitt:
This is a request by Arthur Seymour, Jr., on behalf of Gerdau Ameristeel to close that portion of Tennessee Avenue between Western Avenue and Schofield Street, a distance of approximately 150 feet.

The Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) is presently preparing to improve State Route 62 (Western Avenue) in this area. Current plans for State Project No. 47023-1257-14 call for the subject portion of Tennessee Avenue to be eliminated and encompassed by these improvements.

On June 17, 2008 City Council approved Resolution R-185-08, which authorized the mayor to execute a proposal with TDOT for this project. Because the subject right-ofway will be needed for the project, the Engineering Department does not support abandoning it as requested. However, we would support closing it to traffic until the roadway is eliminated after appropriate public notice and input.

## Re: Closing Tennessee Avenue between Schofield Street \& Western Avenue

This request is brought about for several reasons, two of which are safety and environmental issues Additionally, when IDOI widens and realigns Western Avenue, a project that is probably two to three years away, this portion of Tennessee Avenue will permanently disappear. Lastly, even though this portion of Tennessee Avenue is posted, "No Trucks", more than half the trucks entering or leaving our plant that is located on Tennessee continue to use this portion of the road

In less than forty feet, two railroad tracks cross Tennessee Avenue. One of these is the Holston River Railroad, formerly Norfolk Southern, and the other is the CSX. In addition, there is a short bridge between the two tracks spanning a fork of Third Creek. The difference in elevation between the two tracks is about eight feet. On several occasions, trucks loaded with scrap coming to our plant have bottomed out on the track, resulting in a ruptured fuel tank allowing spillage of diesel fuel into the creek.

Due to the increase in our outbound rail traffic, we are now doing some of our own switching of rail cars across Tennessee Avenue. This requires us to post crossing guards on Tennessee, which is especially dangerous at night due to decreased visibility. We also would like to be able to spot rail cars on the CSX in the Tennessee Avenue right of way.

There is no traffic signal at the intersection of Tennessee and Western Avenues, nor are there turn lanes in either direction on Western. This results in traffic backups when trucks are turning off of Western onto Tennessee

In considering alternate routes, the closing of this portion of Tennessee will necessitate eastbound traffic on Western go approximately two-tenths of a mile further east to Keith Avenue, where there is a turn lane and a traffic signal, then west on Schofield.

Steve, this is to confirm our conversation about the Police Department's position on closing Tennessee Avenue between Western Avenue and Schofield. We do not have an objection to this action. It will not effect Police response in this area. Traffic from Tennessee Avenue can use Schofield to Keith to exit onto Western Avenue, which would actually be safer as it is a traffic signal controlled intersection. The collisions that happen at Western and Schofield are caused mostly due to the blind curb where the street intersects. This would help the City of Knoxville to reduce collisions at this location and will help Gerdau Ameristeel to reduce the damage to your delivery vehicles. It sounds like a win-win to all. We have reviewed our records and find that we have existing utility facilities located within the subject right-of-way. The approximate location of these facilities is indicated on the attached prints. However, KUB does not release and hereby retains all easements and rights for existing utility facilities, whether or not shown on these prints.

Should this right-of-way be closed, KUB will require the following permanent easement for its utility facility.

Electric - 10 feet on each side of the centerline of the electric line, 20 feet total width Gas - 12.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the gas line, 25 feet total width Sewer -7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the wastewater line, 15 feet total width Water -12.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the water line, 25 feet total width
