Greetings Commissioner:

I wish to inform each of you of my opposition to the manner in which you have dealt with a serious issue involving the "parking" on my private property within this City.

Each of you by a vote of "12-0-1" at your (April 10, 2008) meeting approved restricting my right to park on my property that is most suitable for my condition.

City Council at its' workshop of June 26, 2008, failed to consider any opposition to the proposed ordinance (2-C-08-OA) and in fact did not consider the "Financial Impact Statement" that the ordinance would have on the poor and/or disabled.

Again the proposed ordinance was before the MPC and Council, amended, without being published, October 7, 2008 with several extraneous documents attached thereto. None however discussed material matters relating to the permanent need for the infirm to park in their front or side yards.

I have yards across the city that are less than forty feet wide without a street cut. The proposed ordinance would prohibit my enjoying those lots.

Finally, as you can see from some of the documents I have enclosed; MPC hasn't been too concerned about the illicit businesses on Gay Street et al. in the past (on public streets). The City can abate the junk car nuisance by Chancery Court action.

Re: Proposed Residential Ordinance

Greetings Member:

I rise in opposition to the proposed Ordinance as the MPC has drafted and approved April 10, 2008 and placed on the Council's agenda May 6, 2008. Subsequently the ordinance was postponed and again placed upon the Council Agenda for the October 7, 2008 with a number of photos attached to the new document. The amended document at its' "Background" Clause refers to the older residential neighborhood for restricting "parking" includes my neighborhood but not yours. Is that the American way of doing things????

I have pictures of your property also and some of yours are looking much worse than my properties.

Out of "20+neighborhood groups only 9 (nine) or less were selected to make your composites of neighborhood cars. The NEW Neighborhoods as I have discovered have the most egregious parking problems. The umbrella groups are whiners with an agenda to control the politician at the detriment of the city at large. The Citywide Neighborhood Coalition ("CnC") claims to speak for 38+ neighborhoods yet only 21 (twenty-one) neighborhoods are listed as actual and actively engaged in the sponsorship of the discriminatory efforts of a few political hacks.

You have worked very closely and sometimes independently with CnC in private sessions (see INDEX TO PACKET CONTENTS) at page one of the five page document. Please note paragraph four (4), CnC claims to have worked on your "behalf" ignoring the larger community.

CnC claims to have been "Driven by citizens complaints to 311" but have failed to produce one scintilla of proof to require such dramatic action.

CnC also claims the "Objective" is for "Maintaining property values and for the enforcement by the Zoning Department and potential fine of \$50.00" (see Summary at page 2).

CnC and City officials gathered in private homes and churches without inviting the general public, (see page 4 of CnC Meeting Schedule).

The Ring Leaders and forces behind the proposed Ordinance are not well advised on the serious issues and should pursue their concerns in the Chancery Courts of Knox County of Tennessee. Council Members know the Courts will abate a nuisance if given the opportunity. The Ordinance as now drafted is very silly and should be reviewed in the "light of day".

Let me remind you of a sad and Historical chapter that our wonderful city has been through that should have your attention because it goes to the character and integrity of not only politicians but to all citizens

As a very young police officer I became quite concerned about the Mayors, Council and appointed personnel who were profiting from public nuisances and who failed to ask the Court to padlock these addresses listed and attached hereto. Of course there are many more such nuisances not listed herein.

Attached is a clipping from an old Newspaper published by the (Knoxville Journal) several years ago exposing me to public ridicule for refusing an order given me by a superior officer(s) to collect graft for the Mayor et al.

The Law Department refused to seek abatement from the Courts and elected to charge and prosecute (civil service) me for complaining.

# Patrolman Boyce McCall Suspended

Knoxville Patrolman Boyce T. McCall has been suspended indefinitely while a complaint of insubordination is investigated, Asst. Police Chief Joe C. Fowler said yesterday.

The officer is alleged to have refused an order by Patrol Lt. Jack Brooks to obtain warrants and raid several Knoxville establishments, The Knoxville Journal learned. Fowler confirmed the officer had been



suspended. McCall while the investigation is under way, but declined to reveal details of the complaint.

Fowler said he had not decided what, if any, charges would be filed against McCall. The incident is alleged to have occurred last week.

McCall's is one of a series of recent suspensions. More officers have been suspended in the last year, a veteran officer told The Journal, than in the past 10 years combined.

The most celebrated was that of Traffic Officer James E. (Jim) Shuler, who was suspended recently on charges of allegedly changing his testimony in City Court. He was handed a 90-day suspension by John H. Murrian, Jr., but it was later reduced by the mayor to 30 days and is now under appeal to Circuit Court. Shuler is back on his job.

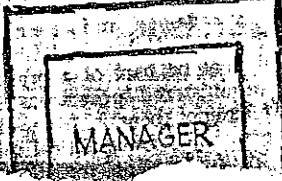
