Metropolitan Planning Commissioners:

The Council Of West Knox County Homeowners voted unanimously to request the DENIAL of Agenda Item #17, File #4-SB-10-F for the final subdivision of Stoney Point Farm.

We strongly feel the historical importance of the birthplace and childhood homestead of the first admiral of the United States should compel the commission to prevent any further changes, modifications, or subdivision to this property until, at minimum, a complete archeological survey is completed.

We further hope the property owner, who already understands the significance of this property as exemplified by the sales flyer for the potential lots, will work with the public and various agencies towards the preservation of the area for present and future generations. We hope for financial compensation to the property owner and a public historical park to be treasured by all, rather than one more private housing development in Knox County.

Please do the right thing for all the people, present and future, of Knox County, the nation, and the world. Deny this and any future proposals which would alter or destroy this special historic location and work towards preserving and maintaining for posterity, the remnants of Admiral David Farragut's birthplace and Lowe's Ferry Road and Landing.
