We understand that the Site work completed to date has been performed without a Site Grading Permit. The State of Tennessee has issued 6 fines because of improper grading and storm water runoff protection.


A vote to object to the Rezoning and Sector Plan change was taken and was unanimous.



We respectfully request that the MPC deny this zoning and sector Plan change.



Dear Ms. Jones:

Thank you for your letter dated March 11, 2009, regarding Mr. Troy Ray's construction upstream of your property along the unnamed tributary to Twin Creek.

My staff has inspected the site several times over the last several months and issued two notices of violation (NOVs) requiring permit submittals, installation and maintenance of erosion prevention and sediment control (EPSC) measures and removal of sediment from the unnamed tributary to Twin Creek. Personnel with Knox County also inspected the site several times and issued multiple NOVs with penalties.

Although Mr. Ray has made some improvements to the site since our initial investigation, the EPSC measures have not been properly maintained, and sediment had migrated into the stream. The division issued a Director's Order on March 23, 2009. This Order assesses a \$10,000.00 penalty and contingency requirements to install and maintain EPSCs and remove sediment deposits from the unnamed tributary to Twin Creek. I have enclosed a copy of Director's Order WPC09-0029.

Thank you for your interest in clean water and in Tennessee's rich natural and cultural resources.




