
Staff has received no objections to this closure. The closure of this portion of Orange Avenue will not adversely impact public access to property in the area.

COMMENTS:

The City of Knoxville proposes to consolidate all the individual parcels for redevelopment of the site. The closure of this and several other rights-of-way in this area are necessary in order to consolidate all the property. In this area, there are four other right-of-way closure proposals by the City also on this agenda.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on 3/9/2010 and 3/23/2010. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.

SUBJECT: Request to Close Orange Avenue from Western Avenue to Its Southern

Terminus

MPC File # 2-B-10-SC / City Blocks 22042, 22043, 22061, and 22062

Dear Mr. Brusseau:

This portion of Orange Avenue is bounded on the northwest by the J. C. Sterchi Addition (Map Bk. 4, Pg. 102) and on the southeast by F. L. Ambrister's West View Addition (Map Bk. 4, Pg. 64). If it were to be closed, Lots 1-11 in Block 7 and Lots 6, 7, and part of 8 in Block 6 of the Sterchi Addition would become landlocked. Lots 1-15 in Block 1 and Lots 1-5 and part of Lot 6 in Block 3 of the West View Addition would also become landlocked.

A remaining portion of Century Street runs northwest from Orange Avenue. It too would become landlocked if Orange Avenue were to be closed.

Ambrister Street connects Orange Avenue to News Sentinel Drive. If Orange Avenue were to be closed, Ambrister Street will not have an outlet to another public road.

For these reasons the Engineering Department can support this request only with the following conditions:

- 1. The remaining portion of Century Street shall be closed before or concurrently with this portion of Orange Avenue.
- 2 Ambrister Street shall be closed before or concurrently with this portion of Orange Avenue, or a public turn-around shall be dedicated at the northwest end of Ambrister Street.
- 3. Property owner(s) shall prepare and record a new subdivision plat that results in no landlocked property.
- 4 The closing ordinance shall state that this closure shall not become effective until the above plat has been approved by the Metropolitan Planning Commission and recorded with the Knox County Register of Deeds, and the Engineering Department has sent a memo to the City Recorder verifying that all conditions have been met

5. The closing ordinance shall also state that if the plat is not recorded within one year from the date City Council gives its final approval, this right-of-way closure shall be deemed to be null and void and of no effect.
