## STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

## - APPROVE the street name 'Charlie Haun Drive'. (Applicant requested 'Way')

Classification of the street as 'Way' does not meet certain requirements of the Uniform Street Naming and Addressing System Ordinance. Charlie Haun Drive, as recommended, meets all requirements.

## COMMENTS:

On October 4, 2010, Knoxville City Council's Public Property Naming Committee approved the name 'Charlie Haun Way', subject to approval of this request by MPC. Assigning of the road type as 'Way' does not meet the requirements of the "Addressing Guidelines and Procedures" section of MPC's Administrative Rules and Procedures. 'Drive' would be the appropriate road type designation if this name change is approved, as it is applicable to public streets generally extending easterly/westerly. Also, the proposed street to be renamed lines up with Centerline Dr. to the northeast, making the use of the road type 'Drive' more appropriate. The road type 'Way' is for private easements serving six or more lots or dwelling units in a residential development or lots/buildings in a non-residential development. With the exception of using the road type 'Way', the original application meets addressing ordinance requirements. Property owners along the section of street proposed to be renamed have signed the 'canvassing form', indicating agreement with the street name change.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on $5 / 17 / 2011$ and $5 / 31 / 2011$. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.

The City Council's Public Property Naming Committee (PPNC) met in session at 5:30 p.m. in the Main Assembly Room of the City-County Building on Monday, October 4, 2010

Councilmember Joe Bailey was present and presiding officer of the committee.
The following committee members were present: Vice-Mayor Bob Becker, Jim Bletner, Councilmember Dan Brown, Councilmember Nick Della Volpe, Mark Donaldson, Rick Emmett, Susan Hardin, Jim Johnson, Lynne Miller, George Prosser

Members absent: Marcus Blakemore, David McGinley and Sarhonda Thompson.

## Call to Order

Chairman Bailey called the meeting to order.
George Prosser led in the Invocation and Vice-Mayor Becker led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

## Items of Business

## 1. REQUEST TO RENAME THE NEW KNOXVILLE STATION TRANSIT CENTER TO JOHN J. DUNCAN, JR. - KNOXVILLE STATION Applicant: Mayor Bill Haslam

Speakers in favor: Melissa Roberson, Chief Administrative Officer of Knoxville Area Transit; Representative Ryan Haynes; Alan Carmichael, Moxley Carmichael Public Relations Firm.

There were no speakers in opposition
Chairman Bailey addressed the request
Brief discussion ensued.
Councilmember Nick Della Volpe made a motion to approve the name change. ViceMayor Becker seconded the motion. By unanimous voice vote the motion carried. The renaming was approved by the PPNC.

## 2. REQUEST TO RENAME CENTERLINE DRIVE (NEW PORTION OFF VALLEY VIEW DRIVE) TO CHARLIE HAUN WAY (FROM ROUND ABOUT TO WASHINGTON PIKE) <br> Applicant: Alice Bell/Spring Hill Neighborhood Association: Gene Mathis, VicePresident

Speakers in favor: Gene Mathis, Vice-President Alice Bell/Spring Hill Neighborhood Association

There were no speakers in opposition.
Discussion from committee members: Rick Emmett, Councilmember Della Volpe, Mark Donaldson, Vice-Mayor Becker, Chairman Bailey

Councilmember Della Volpe made a motion to approve the name change. Rick Emmett seconded the motion. By voice vote the committee voted as follows: Chairman Bailey, ViceMayor Becker, Jim Bletner, Councilmember Dan Brown, Councilmember Della Volpe, Rick Emmett, Susan Hardin, Jim Johnson, Lynne Miller and George Prosser voted "Aye"

Committee member Mark Donaldson, MPC Executive Director, voted "No." Mr. Donaldson specified his "no" vote by saying the street name "Way" refers to a private street by MPC standards and this is not a private street.

The motion carried. The renaming was approved

## 3. REQUEST TO GIVE HOLLYWOOD DRIVE THE HONORARY STREET NAME "POND GAP ROAD" (FROM LONAS DRIVE TO SUTHERLAND AVENUE) Applicant: Pond Gap Area Neighborhood Association: David Williams

Speakers in favor: David L Williams, 505 Hollywood Drive There were no speakers in opposition.
Committee Discussion: Vice-Mayor Becker, Councilmember Della Volpe, Mark Donaldson, George Prosser, Rick Emmett and Chairman Bailey

Councilmember Della Volpe made a motion to approve the request to give the Honorary street name "Pond Gap Road" to Hollywood Drive from Lonas Drive to Sutherland Avenue Chairman Bailey and George Prosser both offered seconds to the motion. By unanimous voice vote the motion carried. The Honoraty name was approved.

## Committee Discussion

Jim Johnson presented to the committee two possible amendments regarding PPNC fees Discussion ensued with Jim Johnson, Chairman Bailey, Mark Donaldson, Rick Emmett and Jim Bletner addressing the amendments.

Vice-Mayor Bob Becker made a motion to approve the following amendment to the PPNC Report dated 2005 (Amended in 2009):

## Proposed Amendment \#1 <br> Fees

- A fee of $\$ 262$ will be charged to submit an application to the Committee for the naming or renaming of public properties, facilities or honorary streets, except no fee will be charged for applications submitted by the City administration or City Council.
- No fee will be charged by the Committee to consider an application for the official renaming of an existing street or the naming of a new street as such application process and fee collection originates with MPC.
- If the Committee rejects an application for naming/renaming and the applicant chooses to reapply, a new fee in the amount of $\$ 262$ will be assessed each time an application is submitted for consideration.
- The application fee may be refunded when warranted by the Committee.
- Fees for applications for MPC review under the subdivision regulations shall apply in accordance with MPC administrative rules and procedures.

Councilmember Della Volpe seconded the motion. By unanimous voice vote the amendment to the Report was adopted.

## Sign Standards

Kathleen Gibi from the Parks and Recreation Department was present to address standards for signs provided by the City of Knoxville for Public Property naming/renaming. Ms. Gibi stated that the city could provide signs/plaques made from 1) Redwood or 2) Polished Granite and cover the cost. If the community or families wanted to place a more expensive sign/plaque, they would have to cover the difference in cost.

Brief discussion occurred with Chairman Bailey, George Prosser and Rick Emmett speaking.

Chairman Bailey made a motion to adopt the standard presented by Ms. Gibi. Rick Emmett seconded the motion. By unanimous voice vote the motion carried.

Chairman Bailey stated that the committee would discuss language for standards to place in the PPNC Report at a future meeting date

## Adjournment

There being no further business to come before the Public Property Naming Committee, the meeting was adjourned at $6: 30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.
