Dear Mr. Brechko:

In accordance with our recent conversations, this letter will confirm that U.S. Cellular Corporation wishes to amend its pending Use-On-Review Application No. 7-C-12-UR, which is scheduled to be heard on Thursday, July 12, 2012. Such Use-On-Review Application requests approval of a cellular communications monopole at 8164 Monday Road in Corryton, Knox County, Tennessee.

As you are aware, U.S. Cellular Corporation's initial filing for the Corryton site requested approval for a self-support structure 250 feet in height. Since such structure would exceed 200 feet in height, lighting on the tower would have been required pursuant to FAA regulations.

It is my understanding that one neighboring property owner has expressed reservations concerning, among other things, the self-support structure and the need for lighting the structure. U.S. Cellular Corporation strives to address property owners' concerns, and in response to the property owner's questions, U.S. Cellular Corporation requested its engineers to review the specifications for the Corryton site. Upon such review, U.S. Cellular Corporation's engineers determined that by taking additional steps, including but not limited to changing certain



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equipment on U.S. Cellular Corporation's adjacent cell towers, U.S. Cellular Corporation could meet its coverage needs by reducing the height of the proposed structure from 250 feet to 195 feet, and by changing from a self-support structure to a monopole. Further, by reducing the height of the structure from 250 feet to 195 feet, the monopole will not require lighting because applicable FAA regulations generally require lighting only on towers in excess of 200 feet. U.S. Cellular Corporation is pleased to respond to this neighboring property owner's concerns in this manner, even though these changes will require an increased capital expenditure.

Therefore, in summary, U.S. Cellular Corporation wishes to amend its Use-On-Review Application No. 7-C-12-UR by (i) changing the type of structure from a self-support structure to a monopole; (ii) lowering the height of the structure from 250 feet to 195 feet; and (iii) eliminating the lighting on the structure. U.S. Cellular Corporation will submit revised construction plans to the Metropolitan Planning Commission reflecting these changes as soon as such revised plans are prepared.
