► APPLICANT'S REASON FOR CLOSURE:

The subject alley is rarely used by campus residents. UT owns all the property on each side of the alley. Therefore, closure of this alley does not restrict any private property. In addition, UT is in the early design phase to construct a 700-bed apartment complex adjacent to the alley, Eventually, the alley will be utilized as a loading and unloading lane for

the new housing facility.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION:


## RECOMMEND that City Council APPROVE the closure of Boling Alley, subject to any required easements.

Staff has received no objections to this closure. The University of Tennessee owns all the property fronting along this right-of-way.

## **COMMENTS:**

All of the parcels that front on this alley also have access to one of the four public streets surrounding the area. so no access to existing lots will be lost due to this proposed closure. Closure of this alley as a public right-ofway will result in the alley becoming privately maintained by the University of Tennessee. It will also allow UT, if desired, to combine lots that are currently separated by the public alley, to create a larger site for future development.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on 7/10/2012 and 7/24/2012. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.



Re: Right-of-Way Closure Request 6-A-12-AC

Block No. N/A CLT No. 108 Parcel No. 26

We have reviewed our records and find that we have existing utility facilities located within the subject right-of-way. The approximate location of these facilities is indicated on the enclosed prints. However, KUB does not release and hereby retains all easements and rights for existing utility facilities, whether or not shown on these prints.

Should this right-of-way be closed, KUB will require the following permanent easement for its utility facility.

Electric – 10 feet on each side of the centerline of the electric line, 20 feet total width Gas – 7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the gas line, 15 feet total width Sewer – 7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the wastewater line, 15 feet total width

So long as these conditions are met, KUB has no objection to the closure of this right-of-way. If you have any questions regarding this matter, please call me at (865) 558-2291.
