STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

- ▶ RECOMMEND that City Council APPROVE the closure of the proposed portion of Unaka St., subject to any required easements and subject to the following condition;
 - 1. The four conditions included in the attached letter from City of Knoxville Engineering (dated June 4, 2012) must be addressed to the satisfaction of that department.


With the above condition included, staff has received no objections to this closure. The applicant owns all the private property fronting along the north and west sides of this right-of-way. The land to the south of the subject right-of-way is owned by the State of Tennessee and is part of the TDOT I-40 right-of-way.

COMMENTS:

The applicant represents the owner of United Rentals. The only possible destination for someone driving on this portion of Unaka St. would be the United Rentals business located between Unaka St. and Ailor Ave. The applicant has stated that the business wishes to close the right-of-way to the public and make it a private drive used only for access to the adjacent business.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on 7/10/2012 and 7/24/2012. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.

Dear Mr. Brusseau:

City Engineering will support the closure of a portion of Unaka Street from Ailor Avenue to N 17th Street provided the following conditions are met.

- 1. Applicant agrees to include the access way from Unaka Street to N 17th Street as part of this closure request.
- 2. The property owner agrees to complete the subdivision platting process in order to combine tax parcels 3, 4, 5, and 7 as shown on CLT 094KP into one new lot. This will prevent creating inaccessible parcels due to the concrete median on Ailor Avenue and the closure of said portion of Unaka Street.
- 3. The subdivision plat must be recorded within one (1) year upon the final approval by City Council. Otherwise, this process will be deemed to be null and void and of no effect.
- 4. The closing ordinance shall state that the closure shall become effective only after the Department of Engineering has provided written verification to the City Recorder that all conditions have been met to its satisfaction.

Re: Right-of-Way Closure Request 6-A-12-SC

Block No. 22303 CLT No. 94 Parcel No. 7

We have reviewed our records and find that we have existing utility facilities located within the subject right-of-way. The approximate location of these facilities is indicated on the enclosed prints. However, KUB does not release and hereby retains all easements and rights for existing utility facilities, whether or not shown on these prints.

Should this right-of-way be closed, KUB will require the following permanent easement for its utility facility.

Electric - 10 feet on each side of the centerline of the electric, 20 feet total width Sewer - 7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the wastewater line, 15 feet total width Water - 7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the water line, 15 feet total width

So long as these conditions are met, KUB has no objection to the closure of this right-of-way. If you have any questions regarding this matter, please call me at (865) 558-2291.






