Mr. Kelly,

This e-mail is in regard to agenda item number 12 on the current agenda. Knox County Air Quality Management would like to address the following comment listed on the agenda:

“The Knox County Air Quality Management Department on behalf of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has requested that closure of the proposed rights-of-way, and ultimately the construction of the proposed turn around, be delayed until such time that an alternative site for the existing air quality monitor can be found and the equipment relocated.”

It is not the intention of Knox County Air Quality Management to delay the construction of the proposed turnaround or proposed alley. The proposed alley and turnaround must be complete before the lead monitor is relocated. Knox County Air Quality Management requests that the right-of-way the lead monitor is currently located on be retained until the proposed construction is complete and the lead monitor is relocated. Knox County Air Quality Management also request access to the monitor at all times during construction.
