STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

RECOMMEND that City Council APPROVE the closure of this portion of Tillery Rd., as requested, subject to any required easements and subject to the following condition:

1. The 6 conditions included in the attached letter from City of Knoxville Engineering (dated December 20, 2013) must be addressed to the satisfaction of that department.


With the above condition included, staff has received no objections from reviewing departments or utilities to this closure.


COMMENTS:

According to the applicant, this closure has been requested to correct an overdedication of right-of-way that occurred during the platting of the property. The traffic patterns on Tillery Rd. will not be affected by the closure of this portion of right-of-way along the west side of the street. With the recommended conditions from City Engineering and MPC and no objections received, staff recommends approval.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on 2/4/2014 and 2/18/2014. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.

SUBJECT: Closure of a portion of Tillery Rd adjacent to CLT 080DB016 MPC File # 11-A-13-SC; City Block 41610



Mr. Brusseau:

The City Engineering Department has no objections to close the above described right-of-way areas provided the following conditions, subject to City Engineering approval, are met:

- 1. The applicant agrees to adjust requested closure area in original MPC File 11-A-13-SC to only be the portion of Tillery Rd immediately adjacent to CLT 080DB016.
- 2. The applicant shall combine the proposed closure area into the adjoining property known as CLT 080DB016 by completing the subdivision platting process.
- 3. The applicant shall dedicate traversable access easements to an existing public right-of-way, per Engineering Policy No. 5, for existing Water Quality Facility Easements. These easements were dedicated by plat recorded in the Knox County Register of Deeds as Instrument No. 200601060057904 and in the Engineering Records as Map No. 41610-G. The traversable easements shall be dedicated on the subdivision plat required in item 2 above.
- 4. The applicant shall have one (1) year to complete conditions listed in items 2 and 3 or the closure shall be considered null and void and of no effect.
- 5. The closing ordinance shall state that this closure shall become effective only after the Engineering Department has provided written verification, to the City Recorder, that conditions have been satisfactorily met.
- 6. Should this right-of-way be closed, the City will reserve easements for all drainage facilities and utilities, if any, located in or within five (5) feet of the property described herein.

Re: Right-of-Way Closure Request 11-A-13-SC Block No. 41610 CLT No. 80 Parcel No. 16 and 17

We have reviewed our records and find that we have existing utility facilities located within the subject right-of-way. The approximate location of these facilities is indicated on the enclosed prints. However, KUB does not release and hereby retains all easements and rights for existing utility facilities, whether or not shown on these prints.

Should this right-of-way be closed, KUB will require the following permanent easement for its utility facility.

Electric – 10 feet on each side of the centerline of the electric line, 20 feet total width Gas – 12.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the gas line, 25 feet total width . Sewer – 7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the wastewater line, 15 feet total width Water - 7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the water line, 15 feet total width


