APPLICANT'S REASON FOR CLOSURE:	Portion of right-of way appears to have been inadvertantly overlooked when other portions of Sheridan St. and unnamed alley closed by ordinances 0-545-92, 0-546-92 and 0-133-80. This has left a portion approximately 12 feet wide by 40 feet long remaining open and and unuseable by the City.
DEPARTMENT-UTILITY REPORTS:	No objections from any departments or utilities have been received by staff as of the date of this report.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:


# RECOMMEND that City Council APPROVE the closure of a portion of the unnamed alley, as requested, subject to any required easements.

This street is unimproved and is not needed for access to any parcels. Once closed, the right-of-way will be consolidated with the surrounding parcels.

### COMMENTS:

Approval of this request eliminates a small portion of remnant right-of-way that was left when other adjacent portions of right-of way were closed in 1980 and 1992. If approved, ownership of the closed right-of-way would transfer to the three adjacent property owners.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on 11/11/2014 and 11/25/2014. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.
