Implementation of the Campus Master Plan provides an opportunity to implement several capital improvement projects, which includes an extensive streetscape project along this specific street. The University assuming control of this section of the boulevard affords an opportunity to expedite the projects and standardize design guidelines. This shall continue to be a major road through the campus, which also serves the public and mass transit. The City of Knoxville Department of Engineering has submitted the attached DEPARTMENT-UTILITY letter (dated July 28, 2015), indicating that they object to this proposed street **REPORTS:** closure.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

#### • DENY the closure of the proposed portion of Volunteer Blvd.

The City of Knoxville Engineering Department has objections to this proposed closure, as outlined in the attached letter (dated July 28, 2015). The letter lists 4 reasons for the objection to the closure. MPC staff's recommendation to deny is based on the objections by the City.

### COMMENTS:


If closed, the right-of-way will be consolidated with the surrounding parcels. The applicant (UT) owns all of the adjacent property. Should any area of Volunteer Blvd be closed, the letter from the City of Knoxville Engineering Department noted some considerations for the future in the attached letter, dated July 28, 2015.

The result of UT's proposed closures of this and five other streets/alleys within the campus will be that the University will take over ownership and maintenance of the streets from the City of Knoxville. It does not

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necessarily mean that the streets would be closed to traffic or that the street names would be changed, but those decisions would become the responsibility of UT.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on 9/15/2015 and 9/29/2015. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.

#### Mr. Brusseau:

The City Engineering Department objects to the proposed closure area of Volunteer Blvd between Todd Helton Drive and Cumberland Ave. Reasons for objection, in no particular order, are outlined below:

- 1. The Office of Redevelopment has concerns about the requested closure of ROW along the western area of Volunteer Blvd from Cumberland Avenue to Joe Johnson Bridge. In the short term, the route has been designated as a key detour for the Phase I Cumberland Avenue construction. In Phase II, it is anticipated that W. Volunteer Blvd will be utilized as an alternate route from campus to avoid construction in the road diet portion of the project which is scheduled to be completed August 2017. Additionally, beyond the reconstruction of Cumberland Avenue, W. Volunteer Blvd. has more than 50 on street parking spaces that could be utilized to support the businesses as well as university use. The city is currently working to improve on street parking enforcement in the district and long term revenue is an important component of being able to fund this enforcement. (see attached email from Anne Wallace, AICP, Associate ASLA, Project Manager for the Office of Redevelopment dated July 23, 2015)
- 2. If closed as proposed, a dead-end condition would be created at the eastern end of Joe Johnson Drive, which is a State Route designated as SR 450. As of the date of this letter, TDOT has not addressed whether or not they would be in support of this closure and the resulting dead-end situation on Joe Johnson Drive. Separate from any recommendations from TDOT, the City Engineering Department wants to prevent this dead-end condition and cites anticipated traffic flow problems as this area is heavily used for connectivity to and from Cumberland Ave. This need is anticipated to be greater both during the Cumberland Ave Project and after with the expected increased activities around Cumberland Ave once construction is complete. The University Commons Shopping Center is another reason that traffic flow increases are expected to remain in this vicinity furthering the need for the Volunteer Blvd connectivity.
- 3. The City Engineering Department wants to reiterate that any closure area of Volunteer Blvd abutting along the C.S.X. Railroad property may result in the railroad perfecting on certain property rights that may invalidate the rights of use for U.T.'s proposed plans going forward.
- 4. In order for the Engineering Department to support any closure area of Volunteer Blvd at this time, the proposed closure area would have to be adjusted to begin at the southern right-of-way line of Cumberland Ave and terminate at the eastern line of Todd Helton Drive. This would allow for access to Todd Helton Drive, which has reserved turnaround easements at its terminus, and should accommodate an available U-turn option at the intersection of Volunteer Blvd and Todd Helton Dr should Todd Helton Dr be closed in the future.

Should any area of Volunteer Blvd be closed, the applicant assumes maintenance responsibility for all stormwater systems previously maintained by the City, within or near the closure area. The applicant will maintain the approved stormwater facilities in good working order acceptable to the City Department of Engineering. Minimum

## Re: Right-of-Way Closure Request 8-F-15-SC Block No. 10482, 10582, 10600, 10640, 10720 and 10750 CLT No. 108 Parcel No. 11

We have reviewed our records and find that we have existing utility facilities located within the subject right-of-way. The approximate location of these facilities is indicated on the enclosed prints. However, KUB does not release and hereby retains all easements and rights for existing utility facilities, whether or not shown on these prints.

Should this right-of-way be closed, KUB will require the following permanent easement for its utility facility.

Gas -7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the gas line, 15 feet total width Sewer -7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the wastewater line, 15 feet total width Water -7.5 feet on each side of the centerline of the water line, 15 feet total width

So long as these conditions are met, KUB has no objection to the closure of this right-of-way. If you have any questions regarding this matter, please call me at (865) 558-2291.
