The area of requested closure is not, and has not been, utilized for right-of-way purposes, with no street improvements being in place. Said right-of-way is being requested to be closed to aid in cleaning up the City Ward Map that represents said alley within the boundaries of

the owner's property.

► RECOMMEND that City Council APPROVE the closure of the unnamed alley, as requested, subject to any required easements:


This alley is not paved and is not used for vehicular traffic. It is not needed for access to any parcels.

COMMENTS:

If approved for closure, the right-of-way will be consolidated with the parcel in which it is contained and converted to private property. The owner of the surrounding parcel is represented by the applicant and is in agreement with the closure. Having not received any objections to the closure, MPC staff recommends approval, as requested.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on 3/15/2016 and 3/29/2016. If denied, MPC's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal an MPC decision in the City.
