The sides of the road drop down into a tight, overgrown ditch. It is not walkable, and there is no where else to walk or ride a bike, other than in the traffic lane.

Concord Park is located less than 1/2 mile from Jefferson Park; a 10 minute walk if we had access. The proposed Harper's Cove subdivision will be even closer. At night we can see the lights at the baseball fields and hear the crowds cheering, but the only way we can get to Concord Park is to get in our cars and drive there.

If the Harper's Cove subdivision is approved, it will only be adding to the frustrated Knox County residents who do not have a way to walk or ride bikes on S Northshore Dr between Concord Park South and the Choto Circle.

This situation is a tragedy waiting to happen. Kids can not get home, get to school, or get to Concord Park on foot, without mixing with the traffic on South Northshore. Please do not wait for a tragedy to happen before improvements are made.
