I am wring r egarding the proposed zoning change at 434 East Morelia Avenue. The property in queson has historically been a legally non-conforming business. We realize the Plumbing business has invested in improvements to the property and they are a good neighbor. We support their ability to connue as a non-conforming business, but do not support the zoning change that would stay with the property in the event of the business moving. We have met with the owners of the plumbing business a couple of mes. Neighbor s would like an eight-foot privacy fence across the rear of the empty lot that is used for storage and parking.

This area of the neighborhood is experiencing revitalizaon and a c ommercial zoning that would include other businesses types could be detrimental to an inner neighborhood residenal secon.

While we did discuss possibly supporng Office z oning, we are not ready to support that for this parcel. With Recode zonings in transion, the neighborhood w ould like to wait and see how office is worked into the Recode zoning before making a commitment on that type of zoning.
