## STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Postpone this application for 30 days to be heard at the December 10, 2020 Planning Commission meeting.

Staff received an email on November 9, 2020 requesting to revise the rezoning request to ask for the C-G-1 zone instead of the C-H-2 zone originally requested. The C-G-1 request needs to be advertised, which can be done in time for the December 10, 2020 meeting.

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ESTIMATED TRAFFIC IMPACT: Not required.

ESTIMATED STUDENT YIELD: Not applicable.

If approved, this item will be forwarded to Knoxville City Council for action on 12/15/2020 and 1/12/2021. If denied, Knoxville-Knox County Planning Commission's action is final, unless the action to deny is appealed to Knoxville City Council. The date of the appeal hearing will depend on when the appeal application is filed. Appellants have 15 days to appeal a Planning Commission decision in the City.

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
