I want to tell you what Mike and B & B K9 has done for me. I have two Rottweilers. They are considered an aggressive breed and there are very few places that will help you train them. I have vertigo and stability issues related to my vertigo. I needed a large dog to help me. Mike (B & B K9) is someone that stepped up and helped me achieve that. I had some training before Mike with my dog, but she still wasn't to the place to she needed to be. With Mike's help and knowledge my dog is now a true hero. I can go and do things without my husband worrying about me. We can go on trips now and not worry about being part for any reason. My husband knows that my dog will alert me before an episode and get help if needed. Mike is my hero; I had so many people turn me down and label her as a breed that wasn't able to do what I needed. I take her everywhere with me. She has been to the beach; I can take a walk on the beach again in the mornings without me husband. She goes to Disney World with us multiple times a year. I can go shop, and my husband can ride the rides I can't now without worry. We go to Harrah's, and I can now go and play the machines without being by my husband's side. Mike and B&B K9 has given me my freedom back, without him I wouldn't be able to enjoy alone time on trips and be able to go around town with worrying my husband.

When my female service dog tore her ACL, I had a hard time finding a vet that would treat her without a muzzle. They wanted her muzzled and/or sedated to be seen. It's a stigma that is given to the breed and Mike looked pasted that stigma and looked at the dog. In the mist of my female being down with her ACL I started looking for another Rottweiler to help her if she didn't recover from her injury. I bought my male right before the pandemic hit. Due to this, he was not socialized like he should have been as a puppy. He loves people but no other dogs. Mike stepped right up and said no problem, we can fix that. It will take time and patience, but we can do it. Triton is an 18-month-old 120 lbs. beast that loves seeing Mike. He's issue is not fixed but he can be in the same area now with other dogs and not act like a vicious dog. He is learning and to close B&B K9 will sentence him to a life at home. He will never be able to go on walks or enjoy an outing with us.

Please consider what Mike has done for so many people before you close him down. He is an asset to the community and one that we are proud to have here. My life and the life of my dogs would not be what they are without him.
