

There has been a rash of new construction in this area. Multiple Apartments across from Kroger, multiple apartments, called Farragut Pointe, off of Loop Road. Land is being created in a gully with fill dirt just down the road and now even another dwelling(s) are being asked for. Woody Road serves as a connector between Concord Rd - Campbell Station and Canton Hollow, both of which then carry traffic to the major artery of Kingston Pike. These roads that should function as neighborhood access already serve more vehicles than just residential traffic. They carry significant traffic and yet are built as small county roads that are narrow and curvey. We have experience an increase in traffic in the last 8-10 months and are concerned it will only continue that trend, Please do a traffic impact study before any more construction is done in this area. Please slow the residential growth in the Farragut area. The growth in this overall area in the last 18-24 months has been phenomenal and as a resident of this area, it seems like our lifestyle is becoming overcrowded. We did not choose to live in such high density when we moved here. I have not seen an invitation to a public referendum about how much growth is reasonable and how much is over-reaching. My opinion is that the Council is overreaching and I can't help but wonder if monetary gain is their primary motivator for the decision being made in the Farragut area. My comments are specific to this request, but also address the rapid growth in this entire area. I am asking the Council to drastically slow the growth. You could make a start by denying this specific request, as well as any further requests in this neighborhood.
