

Air Pollution Violation by CalMat Co. in California (2024)

Introduction

In 2024, CalMat Co. faced an air pollution enforcement action issued by the South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) in California. The case involved an air quality violation and resulted in an \$8,800 penalty. The enforcement action demonstrated the continued role of regional air quality regulators in ensuring that industrial facilities comply with emission standards and operate in ways that protect public health and the environment.
