

Environmental Violation by Vulcan Construction Materials, LLC Under the EPA (2020)

Introduction

In 2020, Vulcan Construction Materials, LLC faced an environmental enforcement action from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The case involved an environmental violation and resulted in a penalty of \$68,000 paid to the federal environmental enforcement authority.
