

Environmental Violation by Vulcan Construction Materials Co., LP Under the EPA (2005)

Introduction

In 2005, Vulcan Construction Materials Co., LP was subject to an environmental enforcement action by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The case involved an environmental violation and resulted in a penalty of \$23,491 paid to the federal environmental enforcement authority.
